SYNOPSIS

Ralphie Parker is nine years old and lives in Hohman, Indiana, a generic small town in middle America. The only thing Ralphie wants for Christmas is an Official Red Ryder Carbine-Action Two Hundred Shot Range Model Air Rifle, with a compass and thing that tells time built right into the stock. Everyone tells him that he'll shoot his eye out, so Ralphie will have to be creative if he is going to open the present of his dreams on Christmas morning.

The story is narrated by grown-up Ralph who fondly remembers adventures with his friends Flick and Schwartz in the weeks before Christmas. They navigate a childhood filled with school, bullies, cowboys, girls, and lamps that are curiously shaped like a leg. Frequently at odds with his cranky dad but comforted by his doting mother, Ralphie struggles to make it to Christmas Day with his glasses and his hopes intact.






