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A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTOR

Here lies the question: Does what we do in this life matter, or are we just passing the time?

Why does what we do and how we pass the time matter if we won't be on this "Bitch of an Earth" after we pass? I believe, in an abstract way, Beckett is analyzing just how meaningful our lives are.

Throughout the play, characters ask themselves what to do next – do we exercise, nap, fiddle with our clothing, fight, embrace? How do we bide our time if what we do is pointless? Are we all just waiting for Godot to come?

Godot can be taken literally as we are waiting for God, or it could be that we are waiting for death. I like to believe Godot can mean whatever each individual may be waiting for.

I hope in this production, you are encouraged to take a step back and ask yourself what the point is. It could be that there is none and that is okay. It could be our legacy – what and who we leave behind. We could live for fleeting moments and feelings – joy, anger, fear, love. That is up to you, we are just posing the question.
